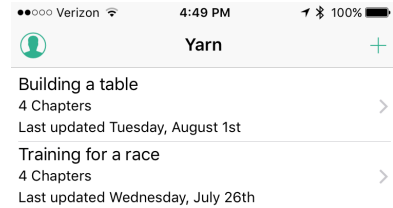

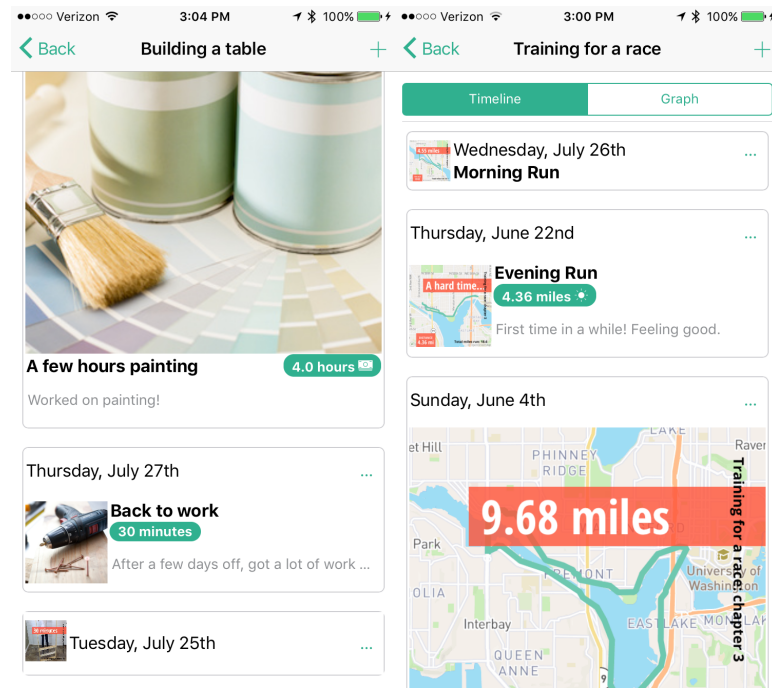

## Using Yarn

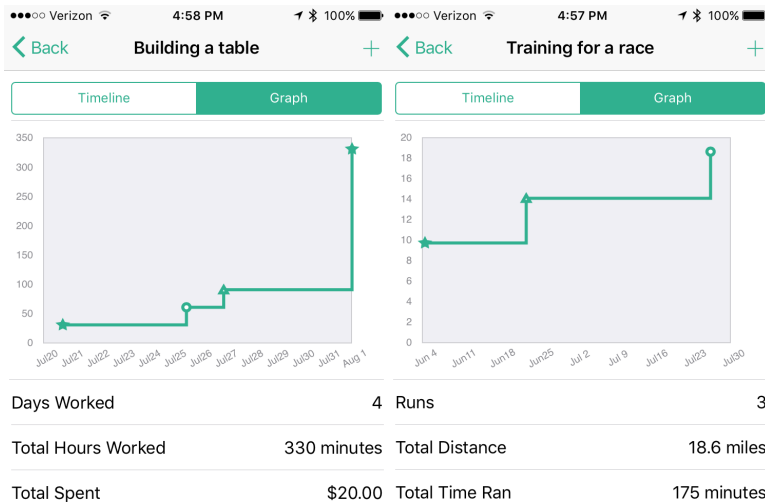
Yarn supports telling multiple stories at once. The default screen of Yarn supports selecting which story to look at or add to. You can make a new story with the “+” button.



Stories are organized into chapters organized linearly in time. You can add to your story with the “+” button.



Yarn also generates a graph summarizing how your story is progressing so far.



Yarn pulls your recent photos and runs to include in a chapter. Yarn also gives suggestions for things you could include in a description.

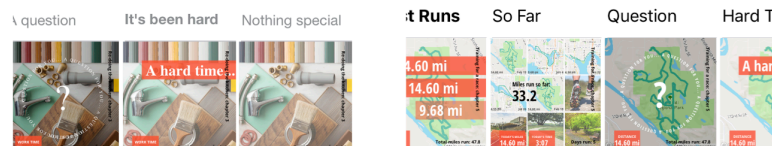
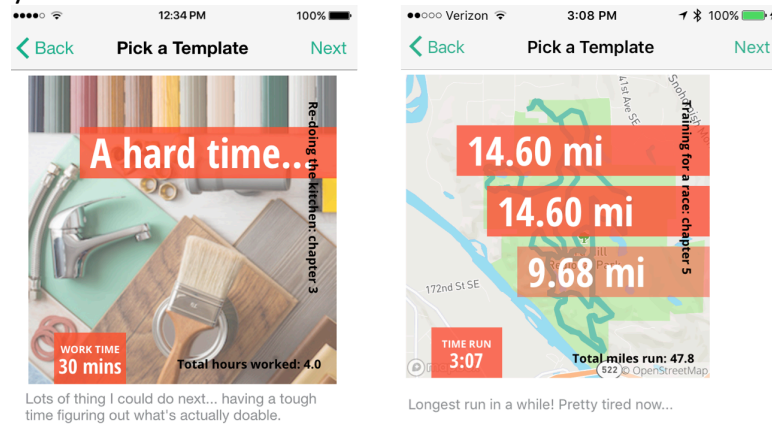

Once you've logged your data for a chapter, you can select a template. The templates emphasize different aspects of the data and chapter. Some templates emphasize your best moments, for example, while others emphasize the challenges you're overcoming or questions you have.



One major reason for writing stories is to tell them to friends and family! Yarn supports sharing chapters via Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and Texting. Yarn lets you send the template you picked, as well as sharing a link so others can read your full story. Reactions and comments to posts made to Facebook are reflected back in the app.
