

MIDL 2026 Camera-Ready Latex Code Submission Guidelines

Prepare your camera-ready submission using the latest version of the LaTeX MIDL template: <https://github.com/MIDL-Conference/MIDL-Latex-Template>. Before uploading it to the OpenReview system, make sure that you have completed the following checks.

1. File Naming and Project Structure

Before submission, make sure your paper compiles correctly with `pdflatex`.

Prepare a single `midl26_NNN.zip` file (Replace `NNN` with your OpenReview submission ID (for example, `312`)) that includes:

`midl26_NNN.tex`: Your main LaTeX file

`midl26_NNN.bib`: A single bibliography file (with the same ID as the `.tex` file)

All necessary figures and files required to compile the paper

In the `.tex` file, ensure the following is included at the top before the `\title`:

\documentclass{midl} % Do NOT use the 'anon' option

\editors{Accepted for publication at MIDL 2026}
\title[Short Title]{Full Title of Article}

\bibliography{midl26_NNN}

```

Do not use `\begin{thebibliography}` to insert references.

2. Package and Style Restrictions

Do not make the following changes:

Do not override options of the `hyperref` package. It is already loaded automatically.

Do not use the `times` package. If it is included in your project, contact the program chairs immediately.

Do not override the `bibliographystyle`, which is already defined in the `midl.cls` file.

3. Authors and Affiliations

Make sure that all authors and co-authors are listed correctly with their corresponding affiliations as per the suggested format. See: [MIDL 2026 .tex format](#).

If a last name contains multiple words, enclose the entire lastname in braces `{}` to ensure correct formatting. E.g., `\Name{John {Smith Jones}}`

For last names that include prefixes such as de, van, von, etc., enclose the last name, including the prefix, in braces. E.g., `\Name{Jane {de Winter}}`

If the first letter of a first name contains a diacritic, enclose it in braces to preserve capitalization. E.g., `\Name{{\text{'E}}louise Smith}`

Suffixes such as Jr., Sr., or III should be written as a separate braced component after the last name. E.g., `\Name{Peter {Hirst} {Jr.}}`

Do not use Unicode characters; use their LaTeX equivalents.

It is very important to follow the above guidelines to ensure inclusion in the final proceedings.

4. Abstract and Title

Ensure there are no Unicode characters; instead, use their LaTeX equivalents.

All math uses valid LaTeX between $\$$ marks.

5. Table and Figures

If a table or a figure is too wide and overflows the margins, scale it using `\resizebox`.

Do not use `\scalebox` as it may distort the layout. To avoid potential problems during publishing, we encourage you to use the `\resizebox` for ALL your tables.

Example:

```
\resizebox{\textwidth}{!}{  
  \begin{tabular}{...}  
  ...  
  \end{tabular}  
}
```

Include only the necessary figures and files in the zip folder, and remove any unnecessary ones.

6. Formatting Cleanup

Please remove all unnecessarily special formatting and visual annotations (such as color highlights or tracked changes) used for rebuttal.

Please ensure that all special characters used in both your manuscript and in XXX.bib file are encoded using appropriate LaTeX commands when necessary.

For example, the character é should be written as \ ' e. Any capital letters in references that need to remain capitalized should be enclosed in braces, for example, {CT}.

7. Appendix and Supplementary Material

Appendices and supplementary material should be included in the same PDF as the main paper.

Place this content after the references section.

8. Page Limit and Content Requirements

The main paper must be no more than 12 pages long.

The validation paper must be no more than 16 pages long.
