

Survey Instructions

What you need to do?

Decide which label(s) describes the image to a satisfactory degree, in your opinion

If label1 is satisfactory, fill in 1 in the “answer” column.

If label2 is satisfactory, fill in 2 in the “answer” column.

If both labels are satisfactory, fill in 3 in the “answer” column.

If both labels are not satisfactory, fill in 4 in the “answer” column.

Example 1: “dog” obviously describes the image, but not “pie”. So we fill in “1” in the answer column.

	dog	pie	1

Example 2: Both “mountain” and “lake” seem to be descriptive of the image. Thus, we may fill in 3 for the answer.

image	label1	label2	Answer
	mountain	lake	3

Example 3: both “night” and “star” may equally describe this image. Thus, we may fill in 3 in the answer column.

image	label1	label2	Answer
	night	star	3

Example 4: There are two reptiles in the image but none of the labels indicates that. Thus, we may feel that both labels are not satisfactory and fill in 4 in the answer column.

image	label1	label2	Answer
 A photograph of two green iguanas resting on a white surface. One is in the foreground, facing right, and the other is slightly behind it, facing left.	bird	nature	4

Example 5: Despite there is “no person”, we don’t consider label1 as satisfactory because it is too general. Thus we answer 4.

image	label1	label2	Answer
 A blue bicycle with black tires and a black seat, shown from a side profile against a white background.	No person	car	4
