Description of Material

This slide deck introduces the foundations of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in an accessible, engaging way, with a focus on responsible use in education. It balances clear explanations of core AI concepts (machine learning, algorithms, generative AI, bias, black box systems) with real classroom applications, benefits, and risks.

The slides encourage reflection and hands-on exploration, using relatable examples (e.g., Grammarly, Google Maps, Canva Magic Write).

Key features include:

- Ethical framing: fairness, privacy, transparency, oversight.
- Case scenarios & group reflections: practical classroom situations where AI may go wrong.
- Interactive activity: teachers evaluate an AI tool (Canva AI) using an ethical checklist.
- Practical outcomes: participants develop a mini "Responsible AI in My Practice" action plan.

The material emphasises AI as a partner, not a replacement for teachers, promoting critical awareness, inclusivity, and human-centred decision-making. It highlights both opportunities and limitations of AI, ensuring learners leave with a balanced and ethical perspective.

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
