Plan Before You Write: Improve LLM writing by planning

Abstract

We present a framework designed to generate and execute writing plans for LLMs. This framework decomposes the writing task into multiple sub-tasks, including novel reflection steps for iterative plan refinement, facilitating a structured approach to content generation. It can be applied both to execute writing plans through multiple LLM calls and to generate training data for supervised fine-tuning. To evaluate the effectiveness of our framework, we developed automated raters trained on guideline-based, human-filtered questions to assess writing quality. We show that the writing outputs produced using our framework are superior to those generated by LLMs without a planning component. Additionally, human raters corroborated these results, with 79.4% of participants ranking our framework's outputs as more interesting.

1 Introduction

The rapid development of large language models (LLMs) has brought significant advancements, yet their performance in tasks like creative writing, essay writing, or deck preparation remains inferior to human capabilities [4, 1]. To address this challenge, we introduce a planning framework designed to generate and execute writing plans for LLMs.

Our planning framework decomposes a given writing task into smaller subtasks, or steps in a plan, each of which is completed using an LLM or another external tool. This decomposition enhances adherence to writing guidelines, resulting in higher-quality outputs by breaking down tasks to emphasize guidelines and provide clear instructions. Our research shows that the model can self-improve [6] its creative writing capabilities by fine-tuning on the outputs generated through our framework. Our results indicate that self-improved model outperforms the standard "vanilla" LLM that does not utilize the planning approach.

Although our planning framework is versatile and applicable to various writing domains, this paper focuses on its application to creative story writing. In this context, users request an LLM to compose a story. Our framework generates a plan—such as designing characters and outlining key plot events—which is then expanded into the final written product.

Automatically generating short stories has gained attention, from short narratives [10, 15], to longer stories using prompting and revision [12, 13, 14].

While these methods often treat planning and writing as separate stages or focus on revising the full generated text, our framework introduces integrated reflection subtasks within the planning process itself. These subtasks, such as 'Plot Twist Revise' and 'Consistency Revise' (detailed in Section 2.1), enable the LLM to critique and iteratively refine specific elements of the plan before text generation, offering a more granular and dynamic approach to plan improvement than existing outline-based or plan-and-write systems. We utilize larger language models, specifically Gemini 1.5 Pro [5], which

features an updated long context window of up to two million tokens, allowing for more detailed planning that translates into better stories¹. We then fine-tune a model based on that output.

Assessing creative content is challenging due to the subjective nature of creativity, as different outputs may appeal differently to various users [16]. To tackle this, we trained automated raters on labeled writing examples and conducted experiments to ensure these raters did not overfit the training data. Finally, we validated the performance with human raters, confirming the effectiveness of our approach in enhancing the quality of LLM-generated writing.

Our approach integrates a structured framework combining task decomposition with fine-tuning, resulting in significant improvements in creative writing outputs. We utilize multi-stage prompting for reasoning [11], hierarchical task decomposition [9], and language model self-improvement [6] to achieve these improvements.

2 Writing Plan

When a writing request is received, we first develop a *writing plan* before producing the final output. This writing plan consists of a sequential list of *writing subtasks*, each acting as a guideline or attribute essential for fulfilling the request.

Each subtask comes with specific instructions or prompts and is executed by either an LLM or an external resource like Search. Our study emphasizes sequential writing planning, where the input for each subtask includes both the initial writing request and, potentially, the outcomes of prior subtasks.

We classify writing subtasks into three categories:

- Aspect: Focuses on a particular element of the writing request, such as character development.
- 2. Reflection: Identifies and addresses issues from previous steps.
- 3. Writing: Produces the writing output.

The final subtask in the plan is always the writing task, and its result is the ultimate output of our planning framework. The plan can include multiple writing subtasks, enabling the refinement and enhancement of outputs from earlier stages.

Figure 1 illustrates an example writing plan for the creative story writing domain. In this example, the first subtask in the writing plan is an aspect subtask that designs the *Protagonist Character Transformation* based on the writing request. The next stage is to generate the plot *Climax* considering the writing request and the character transformation. Subsequently, we revise the climax, add the *Rising Action*, and generate two writing drafts. The second writing draft is a refinement over the first and constitutes the final output.

2.1 Creative Writing Plan

In this subsection we detail about the writing plan we develop for the creative story writing domain. We investigated various established principles for constructing a complete story. Our writing plan was inspired by the five elements of Freytag's pyramid, which are similar to Robert McKee's writing framework [8]. This classic narrative structure is widely used in film and literature.

The elements in this narrative structure are:

Exposition Introduction of the story's setting, characters, and central conflict.

Rising Action Tension builds as the protagonist encounters challenges and obstacles.

Climax The turning point where the conflict reaches its peak, and the protagonist undergoes a pivotal decision or action.

Falling Action Consequences of the climax are revealed as the story moves towards its conclusion.

Resolution The conflict is resolved, and any loose ends are tied up.

Further factors considered in the writing process include the story's setting, character arc, antagonist, and character traits. Table 1 outlines the writing plan we used, presenting each subtask with its corresponding rule and a brief description. To mitigate potential issues such as designing implausible events and ensuring consistency, particularly when generating plot twists with an LLM, we incorporated a consistency reflection step. The plan consists of 13 steps: 9 aspect subtasks that establish the foundational elements of the plot, 3 reflection subtasks that refine earlier plot elements, and 1 writing subtask that transforms the generated plot into a written narrative.

Figure 2 shows a condensed version of the initial plan steps for the request: "Tell a story of a woman named Hannah who plans to meet her partner, Richard, at a local coffee shop to discuss parting ways. Richard, an arrogant marketing executive, dismisses her request for a breakup, leaving Hannah struggling to find the courage to leave him." Due to space limitations, we present only a condensed version of the generated plan. The full plan is provided in Appendix B, and the complete generated output is available in Appendix A.1.

Desires: Hannah longs to escape her stifling relationship with Richard, reclaim her self-worth, and open her own pastry shop to pursue her passion for baking.

Transformation and Conflicts: Hannah evolves from a repressed baker into a confident artisan, using her craft as a means of self-discovery and independence. She struggles with the fear of sacrificing security for the uncertain pursuit of her passion, all while battling the self-doubt instilled by Richard. Opposition arises from Richard, who sees her bakery dreams as a threat to their life, and from a rival baker or skeptical investor who question her skills and ambition.

Plot Twist: It is revealed that Richard has secretly been funding a trust for Hannah's bakery and arranged her mentorship with her idol, Sylvia Martel—not to control her, but to protect her from potential failure, driven by his fear of her repeating his father's mistakes. This discovery shatters Hannah's trust, forcing her to choose between accepting his tainted support or forging her own path, risking everything.

Climax: At her bakery's grand opening, under pressure from a renowned critic and grappling with Richard's lingering influence, Hannah finds her voice. She shares her story, earning a glowing review that marks her triumph as an independent businesswoman. This recognition, along with Richard's acceptance, finally frees Hannah, allowing her to fully embrace her success and the support of her chosen family.

In Appendix C we present an example of a reflection subtask, showing how it improved the plot twist.

2.2 Model Self-Improvement

Executing the full writing plan (Table 1) involves multiple LLM calls, increasing the latency between the writing request and the final output. To potentially reduce this latency while retaining the quality benefits of planning, we explore model self-improvement through supervised fine-tuning. Inspired by the effectiveness of using LLMs to generate synthetic training data ??, we utilize our planning framework to create a high-quality dataset.

Specifically, we generated a dataset where each instance consists of an initial writing request paired with the final written output produced by our complete planning pipeline. This means the target outputs in the training data are the stories generated after all aspect, reflection, and writing subtasks have been executed. We fine-tuned Gemini 1.5 Pro on 500 such (request, pipeline-generated story) pairs for 1000 steps. The goal is for the fine-tuned model to internalize the narrative structuring and refinement qualities embedded in the multi-step planning process, enabling it to generate improved stories more directly.

3 Evaluation

Evaluating the quality of writing responses is a critical and challenging aspect of this work. To enable rapid iteration and reduce the cost and time associated with human raters, we developed a method for automatically generating explainable auto-raters based on writing guidelines. This method uses few-shot prompts with yes/no questions to assess writing quality.

3.1 Learning Yes/No Auto-Rater

Our objective is to create an explainable auto-rater capable of distinguishing between high-quality and low-quality samples. We rely on domain knowledge to identify criteria that characterize high-quality writing, such as character development in creative story writing.

For each criterion, we use a LLM to generate a series of yes/no questions designed to assess whether a sample meets the specified criterion. Additionally, we instruct the model to produce illustrative examples of scenarios that should be answered with "Yes" and scenarios that should be answered with "No." Due to space constraints, an example of a generated few-shot YES/NO question is provided in Appendix D.

This approach results in an explainable auto-rater that evaluates quality based on specific, well-defined criteria.

Unlike some methods that may indirectly differentiate samples based on factors like length and vocabulary, our approach generates an explainable auto-rater with questions targeting specific, desired properties. This reduces the auto-rater's susceptibility to unintentional biases.


However, some generated questions might be trivial or challenging for the LLM to evaluate. Trivial questions may result in high scores for both high-quality and low-quality responses, while complex questions may be too difficult for the LLM to answer accurately. To improve the auto-rater's performance, an additional question-filtering stage using labeled data may be necessary.

3.1.1 Question Filtering

We formally define our filtering process as follows: Assuming we have a training subset of high-quality and low-quality samples, we evaluate the performance of each yes/no question on this subset. For each question, we assign a weight and filter out those with low weights.

Let q be a question with an expected answer a for a good sample. For instance, the question "Are the character's actions consistent with their development and motivations?" should be answered with "Yes" for high-quality samples and "No" for low-quality samples.

Given our training data of high-quality (S_H) and low-quality (S_L) samples, we define the average score of question q on set S using a language model \mathcal{M} as $s_q(S|\mathcal{M}) = \frac{|\{s \in S, \mathcal{M}(q;s) = a\}|}{|S|}$. This






Figure 3: The average score of high and low as a function of the threshold.

Threshold

represents the proportion of samples for which the model provides the expected answer for highquality samples. We expect $s_a(S_H|\mathcal{M})$ to be higher than $s_a(S_L|\mathcal{M})$.

Finally, we define the score of a question as $s_q(S_H, S_L | \mathcal{M}) = s_q(S_H | \mathcal{M}) - s_q(S_L | \mathcal{M})$. Questions with negative scores can be filtered out, or only those with scores above a threshold t can be retained.

3.2 Stories Yes/No Auto-Rater

Following the scheme presented above, we developed an auto-rater designed to assess writing quality through a series of binary questions that evaluate the narrative structure. We generated 117 Yes/No questions (e.g., "Does the climax tie back to the story's themes or messages?"), each aimed at capturing the quality of writing based on specific elements of narrative structure. The full list of questions, sorted according to the relevant writing elements, is provided in Appendix E.

For each question, we created examples of both positive and negative scenarios that either comply with or violate the guideline (e.g., "The climax seems unrelated to the themes introduced earlier").

We applied these questions to a dataset containing stories labeled as either "high quality" or "low quality" by human evaluators. For "high quality," we used human-written stories². For "low quality," we used stories generated by a vanilla LLM (an LLM without planning) that were verified to be tedious and exhausting. Our goal was to create questions that could identify flaws in "low quality" writing that the auto-rater could detect.

To ensure the questions did not overfit the training data and could effectively evaluate the writing, we conducted a series of experiments. We randomly divided our dataset into two equally sized subsets: one for training and one for validation. We selected a sublist of questions based on their performance on the training set and then observed their performance on the validation set. Specifically, we filtered out all questions with $s_q(S_H, S_L | \mathcal{M}) < t$ for some threshold t > 0 and measured the gap in average scores of the remaining questions on the high and low-quality examples in the validation set.

We examined the difference in scores of the remaining questions on the validation set as a function of t. Figure 3 shows the results for t ranging from 0 to 0.3, where each data point is the average result over 50 runs. For instance, when filtering out questions with $s_q(S_H, S_L | \mathcal{M}) < 0.2$, the average score of the remaining questions on the high-quality stories in the test set is 0.5, while the low-quality average score is 0.4. This experiment demonstrates the consistency of the questions' scores on the validation set.

We also observed the average number of questions that passed the threshold as a function of the threshold. Figure 4 shows that, as expected, the number of questions decreases as we raise the bar, indicating a trade-off between the separation quality and the number of questions. Specifically, setting t=0.1 results in an average of 22 questions passing the threshold.

Based on the performance of the questions on the training data, we selected 42 questions³ that were chosen at least 50% of the time with t=0.05. We ensured that writing requests and outputs were only used for question selection.

4 Results

In this section, we detail the results of applying our planning framework in the creative writing domain. Using an LLM, we generated writing prompts such as, 'Write a story about a shy high school student passionate about photography...' and 'Develop a narrative about students starting a social media campaign...'". We filtered out prompts that were derived from published works. Our experiment utilized Gemini 1.5 Pro [5], with a 32K-token context window.

We ran our trained auto-rater, on a model without planning ("Vanilla LLM"), comparing it with the same model utilizing the planning schema presented in Table 1, and a shorter plan focusing on "Transformation and Conflict", "Climax", and "Setup" subtasks. Additionally, we compared the results to the self-improved model.

Table 2 shows the performance of our trained auto-rater on 50 distinct writing prompts not included in the training data. The results indicate that planning improves writing quality and reveals a tradeoff between the number of subtasks in the plan and writing quality. We also observed that the self-improved model was able to learn the writing principles from the planned stories and achieve higher scores without planning compared to the vanilla model without planning. Interestingly, the self-improved model outperformed the model with the short plan. Examples of generated outputs from all evaluated models for a specific input can be found in Appendix A.

4.1 Human Evaluation

To further verify our results, we conducted a human evaluation with 13 raters. Each rater was presented with a writing prompt and two corresponding responses: one generated by the Vanilla LLM and the other by the LLM using a long plan. The raters were asked to indicate which output they overall preferred and which they found more interesting.

We collected a total of 35 responses. The planned output was selected as the overall preferred option in 68.5% of cases, while the Vanilla LLM was preferred in 22.86% of cases. In 8.57% of cases, the raters indicated that there was no clear choice. When asked which option was more interesting, the planned output was chosen 80% of the time, compared to 14.29% for the Vanilla LLM, with 5.71% of responses indicating no clear preference.

5 Summary

In this work, we developed a planning framework that decomposes writing tasks into a series of sub-tasks for incremental planning and iterative refinement. To address the challenge of subjective evaluation, we trained an auto-rater on filtered, guideline-based Yes/No questions that effectively differentiate output quality.

We demonstrated the benefits of planning in creative story writing, showing that both our auto-rater and human evaluators recognized significant improvements in quality. However, human raters noted that some stories were less plausible, an issue that could be mitigated by introducing reflection subtasks to verify the plot's plausibility.

Our pipeline also proved effective for generating data for model self-improvement. The resulting model successfully internalized writing principles, with performance open to further enhancement through reinforcement learning techniques. [3, 7, 2].

Our framework's principles can be generalized to other creative domains guided by established heuristics, such as composing screenplays or developing storyboards, through a similar process of planning and refinement.

A Writing Outputs Examples

In this section, we present the writing outputs for the prompt "Tell a story of a woman named Hannah who plans to meet her partner, Richard, at a local coffee shop to talk about parting ways. Richard, an arrogant marketing executive, dismisses her request for a breakup, leaving Hannah struggling to find the courage to leave him."

First, in Subsection A.1 we showcase the output of the model with the long plan, which follows the detailed steps outlined in Table 1.

Next, in Subsection A.2, we provide the output of the shorter plan, which focuses on the core narrative elements, specifically the "Transformation and Conflict," "Climax," and "Setup" subtasks.

Following that, in Subsection A.3, we present the output of the supervised fine-tuned model, which has been trained on 500 writing examples generated using the long plans.

Finally, in Subsection A.3.1, we include the output of the Vanilla LLM, a model that generates stories without any pre-defined planning. All the outputs were generated with Gemini 1.5 Pro.

A.1 Planned Version - Long Plan

The pre-dawn light, a pale wash of apricot and rose, spilled through the kitchen window, illuminating the flour that dusted the air like a fine snow. Hannah worked the dough with practiced hands, her movements a rhythmic dance as familiar as her own heartbeat. The yeasty aroma, warm and comforting, filled her with a sense of peace, a stark contrast to the sterile scent of Richard's cologne that soon invaded her sanctuary. He strode in, phone glued to his ear, his eyes registering her presence but not the symphony of baking unfolding around him. "Another batch, darling?" he asked, his voice clipped and efficient, his gaze flicking to his watch. "You'll spoil your dinner."
